

Another successful clinic completed! The veterinary team from the U.S. sterilized 265 dogs and cats in five days in Pinders Point. We have improved our efficiency immensely since the clinic in January and could have done even more animals had we been able to get them in. News reporting from ZNS and The Freeport News would have helped spread the word about the clinic, but we did not receive coverage for this clinic. We were grateful for the excellent media coverage in January which helped spur residents to bring in their animals themselves. We can only pick up so many! This project is providing a vital community service. Imagine if every one of those 265 dogs and cats produced a litter of puppies or kittens within the next six months - we have thus already prevented well over 1000 potential unwanted babies being born, never mind the progeny of that progeny. We are very pleased with the results and are looking forward to the next clinic, tentatively scheduled for February of 2008.
